

DJ Gay has a long career as a DJ starting in 1977 at a Disco in Lyons Illinois. She went on to play for many different dance clubs and in 1984 started her own Mobile DH service called Her Sound. She played for weddings, corporate parties and her reputation led to playing for Oprah Winfrey's 5-year Anniversary party! Gay continued Her Sound in business for over 25 years and played in dance clubs till 2012.

As well as playing for us for a few years, DJ Gay regularly plays for the CWCJC. She still loves her job. A great dancer herself, DJ Gay has played for all three swing dance clubs and never tires of presenting music for dancers.

DJ Doug has a background in radio, having worked for the NPR radio station WBFO in Buffalo, NY, while in college. He engineered aired programs and interviewed speakers who came to campus, and edited the interviews. He had the opportunity to meet several well-known personalities of the era, including "baby doctor" Dr. Benjamin Spock and campus radicals.

Doug has been DJing since 2017, having done weddings, banquets and club dances. He especially enjoyed the annual church dinner/dances, which for 7 years each had at least 100 people. It was a great time, with a different musical theme for every year's dinner. It was interesting finding songs that appealed to 4 generations of dancers and non-dancers. Themes were "Moon River", "Stardust", "Evening in Paris", "A Taste of Italy", "Broadway Rhythms", "I Left My Heart In San Francisco", to name a few. It was all complemented by a dinner prepared by one of our parishioners who happened to be a gourmet chef!

Doug began co-DJing with Don Mindach and Rhonda Bennett of the Indy Dancers dance club in 2021. It's an established ABA club in Indianapolis that does swing, ballroom and bop "just for the fun of it" as they say. 











